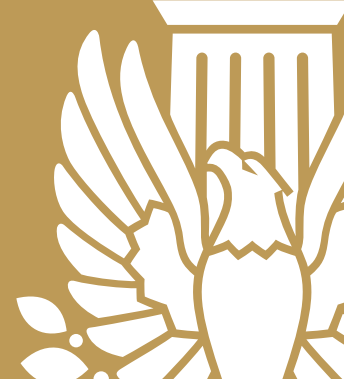

THE FORT THEATRE

The grand opening of the Empress (name changed to Fort in 1940) was on September 21, 1914. The empress was an impressive building and was a popular theater from its beginning. The main floor and the balcony seated 654, more than any other movie house in the city. The Fort and the Empress together gave their patrons seventy years of the best of motion pictures from the beginning of the silent film era to the 1980's. They were family theaters, enjoyed by people of all ages. The building is in a district of other architecturally significant commercial buildings

constructed between 1855 and 1920 that display a variety of styles and types of architecture ornamentation popular during this era. This 2-story impressive building is typical in appearance and history of the majority of the buildings in the district. In 1997 approximately 1/3rd of the theatre was converted into a dental office, 2/3rds is still the original.
