It is with great pleasure that I nominate Dan Worth, FAIA, FAPT, for the AIA Nebraska 2019 Cunning-ham Gold Medal. I have known Dan for over 38 years as an associate and fellow Principal at BVH Architecture. We have worked together on many projects, and I can attest to his accomplishments as evidenced in his AIA leadership, his national and international leadership in historic preservation, his stellar service to the architectural profession, and his generous public service.

His list of completed projects includes over 240 historic preservation successes with the National Park Service in locations across the country, including the St. Louis Gateway Arch, the Harry S Truman Home in Missouri, the William Jefferson Clinton Birthplace in Arkansas, and the Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library in North Dakota, just to name a few. Perhaps no project is better known to Nebraskans than Dan's work on the State Capitol exterior restoration where he developed a unique scientific approach to uncovering and remediating damage to the limestone facade. He also designed interior renovations that met the intent of codes while preserving the special historic and architectural character of this Goodhue masterpiece. His efforts have also resulted in the restoration of other notable Nebraska landmarks such as the Willa Cather Foundation and Museum in Red Cloud, the Stuhr Museum in Grand Island, Arbor Lodge State Park in Nebraska City, William Jennings Bryan Home in Lincoln, and the Mari Sandoz Center in Chadron.

Dan has been involved in numerous preservation advocacy organizations: the Association for Preservation Technology (APT), where he served as Vice President; the AIA National Historic Resources Committee; the Nebraska State Historic Preservation Board; Docomono International; the Preservation Association of Lincoln; Heritage Nebraska; Landmarks Inc. of Omaha; and the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

He has readily shared his experience and knowledge through numerous publications, articles in the national media, and presentations at state, national, and international conferences.

This submission documents Dan's extensive experience and accomplishments that are too numerous to mention in this one page letter. His elevation to both the AIA College of Fellows and the APT College of Fellows recognizes the significant contribution he has made to the profession, and to the preservation of our country's architectural heritage. In my opinion Dan meets all of the criteria required for the Cunningham Gold Medal. I urge the selection committee to honor Dan with this prestigious award.

Dan joined the BVH Omaha studio in 1984 after assisting the city of Omaha with the development and implementation of their Historic Preservation Commission and Comprehensive Plan for Historic Preservation. He grew up in the small Swedish village of Oakland, Nebraska, where he was born, educated, and learned the craft of carpentry from his father. He attended the University of Nebraska-Lincoln and the Architectural Association in London where he graduated with degrees in architecture and urban planning. In 1993, Dan moved to BVH Lincoln where he managed the studio for more than 15 years, helping it grow, thrive, and double in size and commissions.

While studying in London and Europe, Dan was smitten by the historic villages and cities and the importance of architectural heritage to our quality of life. Upon returning to Nebraska, he has devoted his career to the advocacy and development of best practices and innovations in preservation and conservation. He has become a leading voice on the creative reuse of buildings and planning and designing livable cities and sustainable communities.

Dan has a deep passion for preservation, and his accomplishments are easily seen in his significant projects, leadership and advocacy, and generous sharing of knowledge. One would not get an accurate idea of Dan's special abilities without understanding his gentle and kind demeanor and how it makes him an effective team leader.

Dan's accomplishments are characterized by his skill in negotiating with multiple constituencies, from local neighborhood groups to vast and complex public agencies. His success with more than 240 historic preservation projects for the National Park Service attests to his understanding of the constraints and requirements to which that agency is subject.

Among the projects on which Dan has especially distinguished himself are the Nebraska State Capitol where he introduced the pressure relieving system within the façade to alleviate chronic cracking, and his sensitivity in preserving the architectural intent of the mid-century modern Stuhr Museum.

Dan has been involved in numerous preservation advocacy organizations, but one of the most notable is the Association for Preservation Technology where he has served as Vice President and has been invited again and again to serve on conference committees, moderate presentations, and provide counsel to the Executive Committee in numerous capacities. He has proven himself to be an invaluable resource in a manner that reveals his passion for historic preservation.

Throughout his career Dan has shared his knowledge with the public and architectural community through published works and conferences. In the past few years Dan has helped develop a two-hour symposium, "The Art and Science of Preservation," which he has presented at numerous venues. His love for his work and in sharing of knowledge with the next generation makes him an increasingly engaging speaker and teacher.

Dan Worth is a renowned leader in historic preservation. He has completed award-winning projects that restore culturally and architecturally significant sites, successfully advocated for preservation policies, and tirelessly shared best practices and innovative technologies.

#### SUMMARY OF ACHIEVEMENTS

Dan has been a catalyst for the preservation of historically meaningful buildings throughout Nebraska and the Great Plains States, the importance and value of whose architectural heritage was previously unappreciated. His understanding of regional history, technical acumen and innovations, and design sensibilities are the foundation of his preservation and adaptive-reuse projects. By creating and leading initiatives to preserve the region's historic fabric, he has awakened communities to the value of their architectural past. Dan's dedication to disseminating technical expertise and establishing best practices has significantly elevated the standards of historic preservation.

#### **BODY OF WORK**

The enormous volume of Dan's accomplishments speaks to his stature as a leader in historic preservation. For the Smithsonian Institution, he led the planning, programming, and design of 26 National Historic Landmarks, including the National Air and Space Museum, the National Portrait Gallery, the American Museum of Natural History, and the Cooper Hewitt Museum. He designed and oversaw the on-going restoration program for the precedent-setting Nebraska State Capitol, a building of physical and metaphoric importance for Nebraskans.

Dan has pioneered innovations for the sustainable preservation of more recent landmarks, whose materials, construction methods, and uses present new challenges. Among these are Eero Saarinen's iconic Gateway Arch, recipient of a 2018 Getty Foundation grant for restoration; and Edward Durell Stone's 1963 Stuhr Museum of the Prairie Pioneer, winner of the Docomomo US Modernism in America 2017 Design Award of Excellence.

To date, Dan has undertaken more than 240 historic preservation projects in the 13-state Midwest Region of the National Park Service, many of which are National Historic Landmarks or have been placed on the National Register.

#### **LEADERSHIP & ADVOCACY**

Dan has spearheaded the listing of four historic sites on the National Register of Historic Places and their inclusion in the National Trust for Historic Preservation's "11 Most Endangered Places." Those sites, whose preservation he also undertook, include the Dr. Susan LaFlesche Picotte Memorial Hospital, built by the nation's first Native American woman doctor. As chair of the Nebraska State Historic Society's Historic Preservation Board, he led the successful drive to have more than 250 properties listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

Dan's passion for historic preservation is as much about urban renewal and community-building as it is about the architectural richness of the past. He led the development of the Comprehensive Plan for Historic Preservation for Omaha, NE, spurring a renaissance for the rehabilitation of the city's historic fabric. In his two terms as president of Omaha's non-profit citizens' preservation advocacy organization, he was responsible for its transformation into the state's most effective promoter of preservation. His renown as a deeply knowledgeable expert and effective advocate has led constituencies across the country to seek his advice and counsel.

#### **KNOWLEDGE-SHARING**

Dan has dedicated his career to the advancement and dissemination of technical expertise in historic preservation, a rapidly evolving discipline. He shares the findings and methodologies of his projects, in case studies and white papers, with the international community of preservationists, inviting the exchange of ideas and experiences. He lectures nationally and has prepared and led numerous local, state, and national workshops and conferences, as well as publishing multiple books on the subject. For 20 years, he has been an influential leader of AIA Nebraska and the Association for Preservation Technology International (APT), and was elected to the APT College of Fellows in 2010 and the AIA College of Fellows in 2019. Dan played a principal role in the establishment of APT's technical committees on modern heritage and on sustainable preservation, serving as co-chair of the latter. As program chair for the organization's 2015 International Conference, he developed an array of presentations that drew nearly 1,000 participants from around the world.

With his projects, his advocacy, his leadership throughout the industry, and his books and lectures, Dan Worth has elevated the standards of historic preservation, regionally, nationally, and internationally, and spearheaded governmental and community engagement with the country's architectural heritage.

With the enormous number and great range of his projects, Dan has been instrumental both in preserving important examples of the nation's historic fabric and in establishing enduring principles for restoration, rehabilitation, and adaptive reuse.

His work reveals a sophisticated understanding of the intersection of historic architecture with contemporary standards and functional requirements. That so many agencies and institutions have entrusted him with multiple historic preservation projects and related master plans attests to the depth of his expertise, his appreciation of the cultural significance of the architecture, and his capacity for uniting multiple constituencies on common ground.


