## **Legislator of the Year Award Recipient- 2010**

Senator Mello has also been instrumental in passage of legislation relating to economic development in Nebraska.

Senator Mello was elected to the Nebraska Legislature in 2008. He is a graduate of University of Nebraska-Lincoln (B.A. in political science), 2002. ## **Legislative Proposals Introduced:**

- Nebraska Green Building Advantage Act, a bill that would have created new green building tax incentives for LEED certified buildings.
- Provide requirements relating to energy star certified appliances in the state's competitive bidding process (Law)
- Require cities' comprehensive plans to include an energy element (Law)
- Authorize the creation of sustainable energy financing districts by municipalities, Create both short and long-term green jobs through recycling and energy efficiency retrofitting.
- Enabling municipalities to establish Property Assessed Clean Energy (PACE) programs.
